Following the [shrinking](#) of his poll lead to just two points yesterday, David Cameron has come under further poll pressure — this time from Conservative voters. A YouGov/Vote For A Change [survey](#) has found that more Tory voters believe Cameron should allow a referendum on voting reform than hold up the Bill in the Lords, by 45:32.

The survey also revealed only 16 per cent of the public as a whole thought Cameron was right to hold up the bill's passage, with only 8 per cent of Labour and Lib Dem voters opposed to a referendum.

The campaign for PR has been driven rather quietly, and very effectively from behind the scenes by my colleague in Finance for the Future, Colin Hines.
