My major new book, 'Extinction Rebellion: Insights From The Inside', offers a fascinating account of arguably "the most important social movement in history" (*David Graeber, in advance praise for this book*). Edited by Samuel Alexander, this anthology of essays, articles, and interviews present a combination of hopefully inspiring, and sometimes critical, 'insider perspective' into Extinction Rebellion; the first of its kind.
