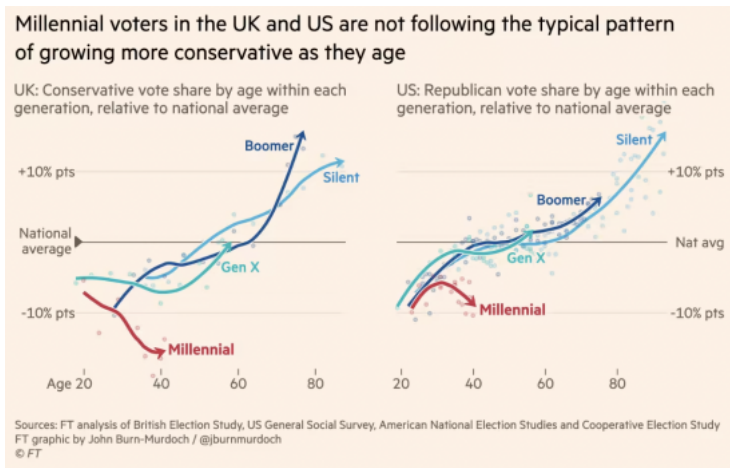


# Funding the Future
