

Where, when, how and with what cost will the madness of...

History recounts that megalomaniacs who have gained power rarely give it up easily. I am increasingly worried that Trump will not.

I worry for the countries Trump is threatening directly.

I worry for the people of the USA.

I fear the price we will pay for this.
