Donald Trump said he plans to speak with Russian President Vladimir Putin on Tuesday. "A lot of work's been done over the weekend," the U.S. president — who is asking the Kremlin to agree to his 30-day ceasefire proposal in Ukraine — [told reporters on Air Force One](#).
