

Morning apricity

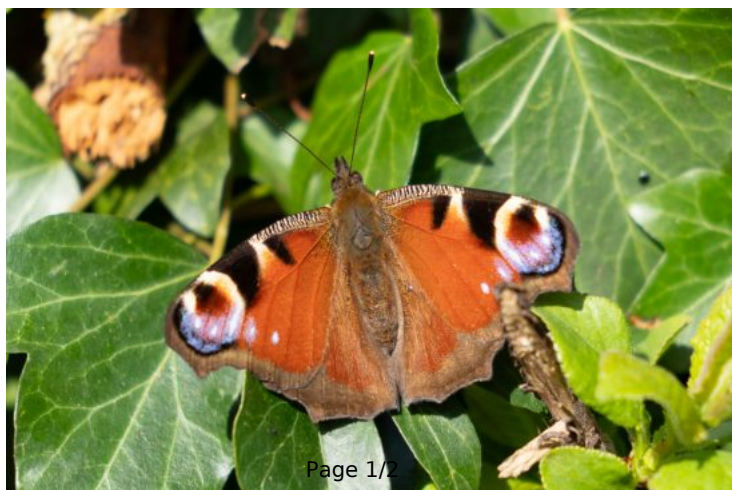
