

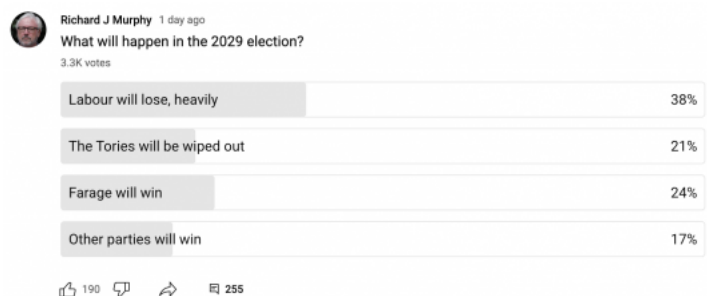
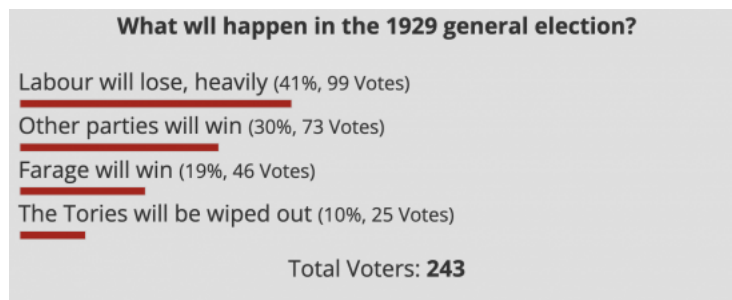
One poll: two results
